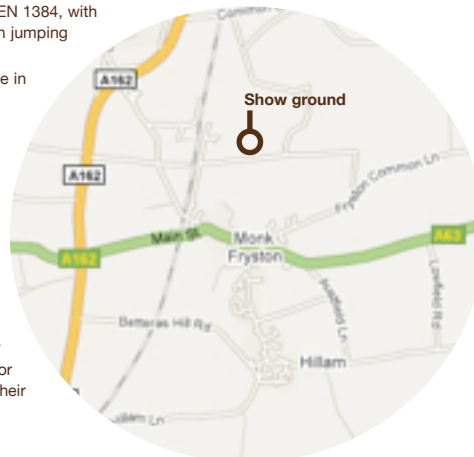

Rules & conditions of entry

1. All persons entering the show ground shall be bound by these rules, and agree to obey instructions given to them by designated stewards and show officials.
2. The judge's decision is final. Appeals must be lodged in writing with the secretary within 15 minutes of the disputed class ending together with a £30 deposit, to be refunded only if the complaint is upheld.
3. For the purposes of this competition a pony is classed as any horse measuring 14.2 hh or smaller at the withers when unshod. A disputed animal may be unilaterally classified as horse or pony at the discretion of the organisers.
4. VHS qualifying classes are subject to additional rules as set by the Veteran Horse Society, see entry form for details.
5. The organisers reserve the right to alter classes, cancel shows or refuse entries without explanation. Changes to the order of classes will be announced at the secretary's tent. Entry fees will be refunded only upon the cancellation of an entire show.
6. Show jumping classes will be run according to current British Showjumping rules.
7. While mounted, all riders must wear hard hats certified to PAS 015 or BS EN 1384, with chin straps fastened, and correct footwear. Body protectors are optional in jumping classes but recommended.
8. Galloping on the show ground is forbidden except on command of a judge in a show ring.
9. No person shall ill treat in any way any animal, in or out of the show rings. On the sole opinion of the organisers, any person observed or suspected to be so doing shall be disqualified from further competition and asked to leave the show ground.
10. Dogs are welcome but must be kept on a lead at all times. We reserve the right to request a donation to World Horse Welfare from the owners of dogs caught on the loose.
11. Please take ALL litter home with you or dispose of it in the bins provided - do not skip lorries out into the parking area. Remember that horses will graze this pasture after you have gone!
12. To the extent allowed by law, neither the organiser nor their representatives accept any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses or ponies, owners, riders, spectators, vehicles, their contents/accessories or any other person or property whatsoever.

In-hand classes

Starting at 9AM prompt

Class 1 Best condition in-hand

Open to horses and ponies.

Class 2 Mountain & Moorland

Large & small breeds - may be split if sufficient entries.

Class 3 Coloured in-hand

Open to skewbald, piebald, palomino, roan, dun or spotted horses and ponies.

Class 4 Thoroughbreds

Open to all ex-race horses which have been in training or bred to race.

Class 5 Young stock

Open to horses and ponies up to 3 years of age.

Class 6 Child handler 16 & under

Open to ponies 14.2hh and under.

Class 7 Veteran in-hand (mixed ages)

Horses & ponies 15 years and older.

June show: VHS qualifier. Highest within age groups qualify, see entry form for additional rules.

Class 8 Bonny pony

Class 9 Handsome horse

 **FOLLOWED BY**
The in-hand mini championship.

Ridden classes

Not before 12 noon.

Lead reins permitted unless stated.

Class 10 Novice ridden

Open to any horse & rider combination who has not already won in a previous ridden class. Walk, trot & canter, snaffle bridle, no spurs, no lead reins.

Class 11 Equitation - 16 & under

Riders up to 16 years old, snaffle bridle, no spurs.

Class 12 Equitation - over 16s

Riders over 16 years old, snaffle bridle, no spurs, no lead reins.

Don't forget to stick around for the mini championships!

Sash and large rosette for each champion.

Class 13 Veteran ridden (mixed ages)

Horses & ponies 15 years and older.

June show: VHS qualifier. Highest within age groups qualify, see entry form for additional rules.

Class 14 Ideal partners **NEW!**

Riders 16 years and under with horses or ponies over 4 years old. Aimed at novices, so looks & conformation unimportant - will be judged entirely on ridden combination.

Class 15 Likely youngster

Open to horses and ponies 4 to 6 years old.

Class 16 Ridden pony

Riders maximum 16 years old.

Class 17 Ridden horse

No lead reins.

Class 18 Mountain & Moorland

Open to horses and ponies.

Class 19 Ridden Thoroughbred

Open to all ex-race horses which have been in training or bred to race.

Class 20 Ridden hunter/cob

Open to horses and ponies.

Class 21 Ridden coloured

Open to horses and ponies.

Class 22 Concours d'Elegance **NEW!**

SEPTEMBER SHOW ONLY.

A chance to dress to the nines and really show off! Astride or side saddle. Open to horses and ponies, may be split if sufficient entries. If there is enough interest we will run full classes in 2011

Working hunter course

All new for 2010! Jumps will not exceed 75 cm.

Class 23 Clear round

Available from 9AM - 3PM,

Open to horses and ponies.

£2.00 per attempt, please pay at the ring.

Class 24 Novice Working Hunter **NEW!**

Approx. 3PM onwards.

Open to horses and ponies - class may be split if sufficient entries.

Show jumping arena

Classes open to both horses and ponies from 10AM.

Riders of ponies may be no more than 16 years old.

Subject to class size, winning show jumpers receive a cash prize.

Class 25 Beginners (max. 50 cm) **NEW!**

Double clear for rosettes.

Aimed at complete beginners, so entrants may not attempt any other jumping class apart from clear round or pre-novice.

Class 26 Pre-novice (max. 60 cm) **NEW!**

Separate jump-offs for horses and ponies. For beginners, so entrants may not attempt further classes in this arena.

Class 27 Novice (max. 75 cm)

Separate jump-offs for horses and ponies.

Class 28 Pairs (max. 75 cm)

Discounted entry fee for each pair.

Class 29 Intermediate (max. 85 cm)

Separate jump-offs for horses and ponies.

Class 30 Open (max. 95 cm)

Separate jump-offs for horses and ponies.

All riders must wear a certified hard hat, with the chin strap fastened, while mounted. See reverse for full rules and conditions of entry.

Class fees: £5.50 members / £6.50 non-members.

There will be a £2.00 cover charge for the attendance of St John's Ambulance.

VHS area qualifiers: £8.00 in advance / £10.00 on the day,
those not wishing to qualify may pay the normal entry fee.
